ORDINANCE 2011-12

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING MAGISTRATES TO ACCEPT INSURANCE TRAFFIC INFRACTION GUILTY PLEAS AS DIRECTED BY THE JUDGE

WHEREAS, by the City of Adamsville City Judge, Honorable Milton E. Barker, Jr. is desirous of allowing payments for insurance infractions and guilty pleas be accepted by the magistrates; and,

WHEREAS, this will reduce time and space on the docket needed by allowing the paperwork and payments of insurance ticket infractions to be processed; and,

WHEREAS, the following fee schedule shall apply to all insurance traffic violations:

Proof of Insurance must be supplied at time of payment in order to be processed.

1 st Offense	\$250.00 fine plus current court costs
2 nd Offense	\$500.00 fine plus current court costs
3 rd Offense	Mandatory Court Appearance

BE IT ORDAINED, the Honorable Judge Milton E. Barker, Jr. humbly requests the passage of this Resolution by the Adamsville City Council to help continue to improve our Courts.

Section 1. Any and all Ordinances in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

Section 2. The parts of this Ordinance are severable and should any part or parts be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such ruling shall not affect the remaining parts.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall go into effect upon the passage and publication as required by law.
